Para 8: Actual Releases by GoI during 2017-18



The amount provided by Ministry of Finance at BE 2017-18 is Rs. 23,500.00 crore. Against the above estimates, Central Government shall provide to the State Government Rs. 135.00 crore as its share as per Section 7(3) of the RTE Act. The State would contribute Rs. 90.00 crore as its State share matching the above Central share as per the existing fund sharing pattern of SSA. In order to emphasize focus on quality of education, it is advised that at least 30% of the releases in 2017-18 are spent on interventions under Category – 1 and Category – 2.

The amount provided by Ministry of Finance at BE 2017-18 is Rs. 23,500.00 crore. Against the above estimates, Central Government shall provide to the State Government **Rs. 136.80 crore** as its share as per Section 7(3) of the RTE Act. The State would contribute **Rs. 91.20 crore** as its State share matching the above Central share as per the existing fund sharing pattern of SSA. In order to emphasize focus on quality of education, it is advised that at least 30% of the releases in 2017-18 are spent on interventions under Category – 1 and Category – 2. **Rs. 1.80 crore shall be utilized for the specific purpose of 'printing of Learning Outcomes Document, leaflets and posters' within the amount estimated under the Project Management Head.**
