Minutes of the Meeting held on 19 June 2019 for approval of Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) 2019-20 of National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR)

A meeting of the Project Approval Board (PAB) to consider the Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) in respect of RTE Cell of NCPCR was held on 19th June 2019 at 10 am in Conference room No. 112-C Wing, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi.

- 2. List of participants is attached at Annexure I.
- 3. The representatives of NCPCR led by their Chairperson, Shri Priyank Kanoongo were welcomed to the meeting. Thereafter, the Chairperson of NCPCR was invited to make a presentation on the activities undertaken by them in the year 2018-19, and to present their proposal for Annual Plan 2019-2020. Accordingly, Shri Priyank Kanoongo, Chairperson briefed about the activities approved by MHRD for the year 2018-19. A copy of the presentation made by the NCPCR is at Annexure-II.
- 4. Chairperson, NCPCR informed that the Education Division of NCPCR has completed following surveys, workshops and consultations approved in previous financial year 2018-19.

Completed surveys/ case studies

- Survey on mainstreaming of Out of School Children (OoSC) in education system and effectiveness of special training to children, and
- Survey on educational status of children of traditional sex workers in India,
- Case study of district Dhulia, Maharashtra with 100 % digitalised Zila Parishad (ZP)
 Schools.

Completed Workshops/Consultations

- National-level consultation on Effective implementation of Motor Vehicle Act, 1988
 w.r.t safety of children in schools and Supreme Court Guidelines,
- National-level Orientation workshop of different sections of local authority on relevant sections of RTE Act, 2009 and its significance in achieving SDG 4,
- Five Awareness workshops of different stakeholders regarding Section 17 of RTE Act, 2009 and Guidelines on eliminating corporal punishment in schools,
- Seven workshops on Status of implementation Hon'ble Supreme Court Guideline for safe and secure transport facilities for children by school,

- Ten state-level Sensitisation workshops on comprehensive manual for safety and security of children in Schools,
- Four state-level Consultations on elementary education of Minority Community children,

- 5. It was pointed out that the NCPCR has not shared report of the completed workshops/consultations/studies by the Education Division, NCPCR for information and reference of the Department. In this regard, Chairperson, NCPCR stated that the individual reports of the completed workshops/consultations/studies will be shared with the Ministry within a week.
- 6. Regarding the remaining activities which are not completed, the Chairperson, NCPCR informed that the following activities are under progress and will be completed within three months. However, NCPCR stated that the two projects could not be initiated due to non-availability of funds. The details are as mentioned below:
